SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

These sailing instructions are an addition to the RTYC Notice of Race for the Offshore Series.

Attention of competitors is drawn to the eligibility and safety regulations as defined in the Notice of Race chapters 6 and 8 particularly 6.6 that requires all yachts to comply a minimum of ISAF Offshore Special Regulations Category 3 with liferaft.

An additional **Race Entry form & Crew List** pro-forma is available on the RTYC website which should be completed and returned with entry fee to the RTYC by Monday 1st July 2013 for those participating in the Offshore Week.

Communication with competitors will be on VHF ch 72 (although if we suffer congestion /interference then VHF ch 77 will be used temporally). All competitors are requested to monitor channel 72 or its substitute for each race whenever possible, from before the start until reaching port as well as monitoring channel 16 which will act as a general safety channel.

Classes

Racing will be split into two main classes. Further divisions may be introduced provided there are sufficient entrants.

Class 1 -IRC

Class II -Non IRC Yachts

Also there will be an overall for Progressive Handicap

Starts

The start will be a single start for all classes and the No.1 warning flag will cover all classes.

The Offshore Series will use the

Warning flag (No1) up at 5min

Preparatory flag (Blue Peter) up at 4 min

1Minute warning Blue Peter down

Go -No1 flag down.

This will be flown from New Moon 2 or substitute committee yacht.

The start will also be given over the VHF radio. The race officer will give out other information on Ch 72 for 30 mins prior to the start so keep a listening watch on leaving port.

Penalties.

The normal penalties as per RTYC SSI's applies, except at the starts where one end of the line is New Moon 2 (or substitute committee vessel, which is competing). If a vessel is over the line, the Race officer in these circumstances will decree a number of turns as it will not be practical to go back to the start line as it will have disappeared. However in some circumstances the Race officer may require the over the line vessel to round the other end of start line mark if this is practical. This will all be announced on the radio by the race officer.

Retirements

Yachts retiring from any race are requested to inform the event organizer Tim Whitehead on board yacht New Moon 2 on VHF ch 72, or via mobile (phone or text) +44 7515 487346. If it is not possible to contact New Moon 2 then information should be passed to another yacht to relay retirement.

Self Timing and Declarations

All yachts should take their own time at the finish. Race declaration forms for Offshore Week can be returned to Tim Whitehead on board yacht New Moon 2 after finishing although times of finish will normally be taken by radio after finishing. If this is not possible, then declaration forms should be posted to the RTYC, Beacon Hill, Torquay TQ1 2BQ, to arrive by 1200hrs 19th July 2013. All races are taken on self timed declarations in BST. *PLEASE all take the time in GPS time BST accurately to Hours Minutes and Seconds* as your bow is judged to pass the finish line. Only use a watch if it is properly synchronized with GPS.

Race schedule

The proposed race schedule is as below, but the race committee reserves the right to change the race schedule dependent upon the prevailing weather and other conditions. The race committee may also introduce an extra race any day if the circumstances allow.

Hazards

The waters of Brittany, Normandy and the Channel Islands have many rocks, strong currents, fishing beds, etc. It is imperative that the skipper and crew make sure they are aware of all these hazards before and during the races and keep clear of them. When entering harbour areas, there are again many shoals and fishing nets and it is advised that all yachts stick to the marked channels.

Breakdowns, troubles, injuries

While we hope there are no problems, if a yacht does have a difficulty then early communication with the committee vessel or closer vessel is important. Yachts **should** go to the assistance of any vessel calling for help. If a yacht does stop to give assistance if possible take note of the time and location when you cease to race and similarly when you restart the race so that fair redress can be considered.

Start Line Guernsey Yacht Club line with outer distance mark as committee boat. (GYC line is identified by a Day-Glo mark high up on the wall of the castle fortifications and an orange buoy approximately 100m offshore) Starting from North to South

Course From the starting line, leaving Lower Heads South Cardinal Buoy (49° 25.837'N 02° 28.558'W) to port, (care should be taken by all yachts around Corbiere-keep well clear of rocks that extend 900 m west of the lighthouse) then to NW Minquiers North Cardinal buoy (48° 59.590'N 02° 20.495'W) to port then SW Cardinal Buoy (48° 54.324'N 02° 19.414'W) to port, then to finish.

Finish Line. A line south of Vieux Banc Ouest Cardinal Buoy (48° 41.833'N 02° 10.205'W). Take your time when the buoy bears 0° within 50 metres leaving it to port crossing west to east.

Shortened Course In the event of light winds, the finish may be taken at NW Minquiers or SW Minquiers when it bears 60 degrees magnetic from your vessel. Announcements will be clearly made via the VHF radio from the committee vessel. Bearings must be taken within 50m leaving it to port crossing North to South.

Time Limit 19.30 BST. If one yacht in a class finishes within the time limit, then the time limit for that class is extended by 1 hour.

Port of St Malo There is a distance of 6.5 miles from the finish to the lock entrance. Lock to Port Vauban operates inbound 0.5 hours, at 1.5 hours and 2.5 hours after HW so all yachts should aim to be at waiting pontoon outside the lock 15 minutes prior to a lock time. There are waiting pontoons just outside. We estimate the lock should therefore open at 16.13, with last lock at 21.13hrs. If any yacht fails to arrive in time for the lock then they can moor in the Basse Sablons Marina which is open most of the time during Neaps.

Please ensure you radio through to New Moon 2 with your finishing time within an hour of finishing remember BST and verified to GPS or if not possible complete this declaration and send/hand to Race officer on New Moon 2

Course from Start Line to Banchenou (48° 40.463N 02° 11.481W) leave to starboard then to Vieux-Banc-Ouest Cardinal Buoy (48° 41.833'N 02° 10.205'W) leave to starboard (Care should be taken to avoid the rock to the north East) then to Vieux-Banc East Cardinal Buoy (48°42.400N 02° 9.130W) leave to starboard then to finish.

Course may be changed prior to the start or shortened during race. Also this area is rocky familiarise yourself with the marks being used and where the dangers are and obviously keep a safe distance.

Shortened Course In the event of light winds, the finish may be taken at NE Minquiers when it bears 40 degrees magnetic from your vessel. Announcements will be clearly made via the VHF radio from the committee vessel. Bearings must be taken within 50m leaving it to port crossing South to North.

Time Limit 1800 BST. If one yacht in a class finishes within the time limit, then the time limit for that class is extended by an hour.

Then to Fairway North Cardinal buoy (49° 09.532'N 02° 12.289'W) to port then to Corbiere to starboard (care should be taken by all yachts around Corbiere keep well clear of rocks that extend 900 m west of the lighthouse) then to Lower Heads South Cardinal Buoy (49° 25.837'N 02° 28.558'W) to port, then to the finish line.

The Finish

The Finishing Line will be a transit of the lighthouse at the entrance of the Victoria Marina (49° 27.317N 02° 32.029'W) with the northern side of the Castle Breakwater below the Breakwater lighthouse. This Victoria Marina light should bear 275degrees magnetic.(if in poor visibility then the Victoria Breakwater lighthouse should bear 270 degrees magnetic) . Yachts must cross this line within 400 metres of the lighthouse.

Time Limit 1800 BST. If one yacht in a class finishes within the time limit, then the time limit for that class is extended by 1 hour.
